Message: When family and friends get in the way of following Jesus		
Passage: Mark 3: 19-35		
ntro:		
Mark is writing mainly to a R audience rather than to a primarily Jewish eader as Matthew directs his words to. Mark focuses on action rather than teaching. Romans valued action over discourse.		
Jesu and His disciples enter a house- perhaps Peters and Andrews, as their house seems to have been a sort of headquarters in Capernaum.		
Mark 3: 20-21		
'They" or literally, "those from His side" could be his immediate family, outer circle of disciples, or friends He had grown up with in Nazareth.		
They felt that Jesus was not taking p c of Himself, not eating, or sleeping properly. And He is always at odds with the church leaders which to many did not make sense.		
Jesus lived an intense, sacrificial life.		
He sympathized with people like no one before Him.		
He engaged their pain, hurt, sickness, rejection, and possession by evil.
