The only difference is how the seed is received. Four types of soil: **One**: The W -beside the road-the beaten path along the road. The soil would be very hard in this place and unplowed. Here seed would remain on the surface where it would quickly be snatched up by the birds that followed the sower. The seed does not sprout at all. **Two**: R ground- shallow soil on top of rock beds-typical in the land of Israel The seed is unable to penetrate the rock so the sprouting seed could not take root and when the sun hit it, it was scorched. Plus, there was no nourishment in the thin coating of soil. The see sprouts but quickly withers. **Three**: T soil- soil infested with thorns and weeds. The fast-growing weeds/thorns choked out the spouting grain. The weeds/thorns may have been cut down, but their roots remained, and they quickly grew back.
