I) Mark: The P	
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Mark is a book of action. The word "**immediately**" is used 42 times, 9 times in the first chapter.

What we know about John Mark is: *Acts 12: 11-17* 

- ➤ He was the son of a lady named Mary who lived in Jerusalem.
- > John is his Hebrew name and Mark is his Roman name.
- ➤ Peter rushed to his house after being released from prison and found the people praying for him to be freed from jail.
- ➤ His home may have been the location of the Upper Room mentioned in *Acts 1: 13-14* and Jesus may have had His last supper with his disciples there.
- ➤ He was Barnabas's cousin Col. 4:10
- ➤ He went on missionary journeys with Paul and Barnabas: Acts 12: 25
- ➤ During one of those journeys Mark seems to have gotten homesick or unable to stand the rigors of the travel and left the party: *Acts 13:13*; Barnabas wanted to give him a second chance (*Acts 15: 36-38*) but Paul refused.
- ➤ The rift with Paul was later healed (Col. 4: 10-11) and near the end of his life, secluded in prison he asks Mark to come to him (2 Tim. 4: 11)
- > Peter refers to Mark as his son: 1 Peter 5: 13. Mark is with Peter in Rome around 63 A.D.
- Mark is the earliest of the four gospels to be written.

Tradition says that Mark was sent by Peter on a mission to Egypt and that he founded the church at Alexandria and became its first bishop and that he was martyred there in 68 A.D.

The key verse is Mark 10:45: Christ the Servant
